Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13

Gospel: John 20: 19-23

#### **SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS**

Pentecost which means fiftieth was the second of three most important Jewish Feasts. For the Jews it was a day of thanksgiving for the completion of the harvest. It occurred seven weeks after the Passover and on this day the first fruits of the wheat crop were offered to God. It was on the Day of Pentecost the Holy Spirit promised by Jesus came down up on the Apostles in the form of tongues of Fire and rested on them, and thus marked the beginning of the New Israel, the Church.

In the First Reading from The Acts of the Apostles, In obedience to Jesus' command to remain in the upper room, the disciples gathered in Jerusalem and waited in prayer for the fulfillment of the promise of being anointed by the Holy Spirit. This promise was fulfilled on the Day of Pentecost. It symbolized a new creation. In Genesis 1:2 we read that *Ruha* (*Spirit*) *swept over the waters*, and this was the beginning of creation. In the same way the descending of the Holy Spirit marked a new creation- Church. On that day there was also a reversal of Genesis 11:9, the Lord confused their language and were unable to understand each other. On the day of

Pentecost even if Peter was speaking in Aramaic people from all over the world speaking different languages were able to understand the message.

Today's Second Reading form the First Letter to Corinthians St. Paul presents the Church as the Body of Christ with different members and each member is given different ministries and specific Charisms needed to fulfill the ministry and thus to build up the church. When each one uses the charism responsibly it will wellbeing of the contribute to the total body Christ, the Church. Since all are baptized in the same Holy Spirit and given the same Living Water, the Holy Spirit, to drink all are one in Christ. The Jews and Greeks, slaves and free all are baptized in the same Spirit, and this is the reason for the unity in the Church. This explains the unity in diversity existing in the Holy Catholic Church.

The Gospel of Today is the version of St. John about the conferring of the Holy Spirit up on the Apostles. After wishing them peace which is a Jewish way of greeting each other (Shalom), and a gift of the Risen Lord to the world (John 14:27) Jesus breathed on them and conferred the Holy Spirit. Here John uses a play of Words, the word for breath and Spirit are the same Greek word *Pneuma*. The breath that came out of Jesus was his own Spirit, and that Spirit was conferred to the Disciples. Then he shared His own ministry of reconciliation with the Disciples. They were given the authority to forgive the sins and send out to the whole world to reconcile everybody with God. Sin separated mankind from God and divided humanity. Now the ministry of reconciliation Jesus inaugurated and handed over to the Church by forgiving the sins is to be continued till the end of the World.

All the three readings convey the message of unity effected by the Holy Spirit. On the Feast Day of Pentecost let us pray ardently for this unity in our families, communities, in the Church, and the whole world.
